DATA PROTECTION NOTICE

The European Data Protection Supervisor (“EDPS”) and the European Data Protection Board (“EDPB”) (hereinafter, “we”, “us”, “our”), process your personal data to organise and manage the Lunch Conference “*The Impact of AI on Data Protection: Ensuring privacy in the era of innovation*” organised by the EDPS and EDPB trainees (hereinafter, “the Conference”).

We process your personal data based on Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 and Decision No 1247/2002/EC (hereinafter “the Regulation”).

The following information is provided as established in Articles 15 and 16 of the Regulation.

Who are the controllers of this processing activity?

The EDPS and the EDPB are joint controllers for this processing activity. As such, the EDPS and EDPB jointly determine how and why this personal data is collected and processed in the context of the Conference¹.

For which purposes do the controllers process your personal data?

We collect and process your personal data only for the purposes of the event management, which involves the following processing activities:

- Organising, managing and ensuring follow-up to the event;
- Sending email invitations, managing registrations and processing participation requests;

- Sharing content of the event via the EDPB/EDPS' communication channels (social media: EDPB and EDPS's Twitter, EDPS's LinkedIn, YouTube, EU Voice and EU Videos accounts (“EDPB/EDPS social media accounts”) and the EDPS/EDPB website).

You will only be photographed and video-recorded for communication purposes. Please see below more information under the “What is the legal basis?” section. Photos and video taken under private capacity do not fall under the responsibility of the EDPS or the EDPB.

In case your personal data is published on the EDPB Twitter account or the EDPS social media accounts, the EDPB/EDPS, on the one hand, and Twitter, LinkedIn and YouTube, on the other hand, are separate controllers for this processing activity².

The **European Parliament (EP)** is a separate controller regarding processing of personal data via Cisco Webex, which will be used as a video-conference tool (hereinafter “Webex”). It is part of the EP's IT infrastructure on which the EDPS and the EDPB depend³.

The EP is also controller regarding access of in-person participants into the Conference premises⁴.

What personal data do we process?

The EDPS and EDPB process the following categories of personal data collected via a dedicated [registration form](#):

- first and last name;
- e-mail address;
- the organisation you are affiliated to;
- your role/ occupation;

In case you are not working for the European Parliament, EDPB, EDPS or European Ombudsman or do not have an EP's badge, you need also to provide the following data in order to access the building:

- date of birth;
- nationality;
- type and number of an official identity document;

The **EDPS and EDPB** also process the following categories of personal data:

- photo and biography of the speakers for reference;
- photographs and audio-video recording and web streaming of speakers participating in the panel of the Conference, as well as of participants participating in the event and in the Q&A sessions;

- your IP address, source Transmission Control Protocol (TCP) port associated to each HTTP request and date and time of the visit of the website, see the EDPS website [data protection notice](#);
- data regarding your browsing experience on our website for aggregated statistics, more information can be found on the EDPS website [cookies notice](#).

Who can access your data?

- Your personal data will be accessed by a limited number of EDPS and EDPB staff, including trainees, who are in charge of the Conference's organisation, and where necessary in view of their tasks regarding this specific processing operation;
- Some of your personal data (as mentioned above) will be shared with the security staff of the EP to allow your in-person participation at the Conference premises. A manual check of the identification document might be performed by the security guards.
- Bodies charged with a monitoring or inspection task in application of EU law, e.g. OLAF, European Ombudsman, EDPS, Court of Auditors, as well as staff of other services, where necessary in the context of official investigations or for audit purposes;
- The Court of Justice of the European Union, where necessary;
- In the context of access to documents requests, in accordance with the provisions of the Regulation 1049/2001⁵, members of the public.

What is the legal basis?

For the purposes of **organisation, management and follow-up** of the Conference, we rely on Article 5(1)(a) and 5(2) of the Regulation. This is based, for the EDPS, on Article 57(1)(b) of the Regulation providing that the EDPS *'shall [...] promote public awareness and understanding of the risks, rules, safeguards and rights in relation to processing.'* and Article 57(1)(c) *'promote the awareness of controllers and processors of their obligations under this Regulation'*. The EDPB, on the other hand, relies on Article 75(6)(c) GDPR⁶ (*"communication with other institutions and the public"*).

For the purposes of **participation, publication and dissemination** of the Conference we rely on your consent, which is based on Article 5(1)(d) and Article 7 of the Regulation.

You will only be photographed and video-recorded for communication purposes, based on your consent. You may provide such consent via the registration form and via a sticker system. Video recordings of speakers will be published on the EDPS website and the EDPB/EDPS social media accounts, based on your consent collected via the registration form.

Where we are required to process data for the purposes of **audits and investigations** by relevant EU bodies (e.g., European Court of Auditors), requests for access to documents under Regulation

1049/2001, and/or requests for data subject rights under Regulation 2018/1725, the lawfulness of said processing rests on Article 5(1)(b) and Article (2) of the Regulation.

How long do we keep your personal data?

- Your personal data submitted via the **registration form** will be kept for six months following the Conference or at the latest after the last follow-up action;
- Videos and photos of the Conference will be archived after 10 years and will not be available on the EDPS/ EDPB website anymore after that period;
- Please refer to the EDPS website [data protection notice and the](#) EDPS website [data protection notice regarding the applicable retention period on](#) your IP address, source Transmission Control Protocol (TCP) port associated to each HTTP request and date and time of the visit of the website, data regarding your browsing experience on our website for aggregated statistics;
- Data processed for building access by the EP for security purposes (date of birth, nationality, type and number of an identity document) will be retained for 1 year (2 years in case of investigations). Please refer to the applicable EP [data protection notice](#) for more information.
- Your personal data will be available on EDPB/EDPS social media accounts for as long as it is published there. Please note however that, once information, including personal data, is uploaded online, it can be used by third parties for their own purposes, in their own platforms, and sometimes without the EDPB/EDPS being informed. In such cases, please note that it may not be possible for us, notwithstanding any implemented safeguards, to ensure removal of your data from the internet.

What are your rights regarding your personal data?



The **right to be informed** of what happens to your personal data, such as how we collect and use it, how long we will keep it and whom it will be shared with. We are informing you of how we process your personal data with this notice.



The **right of access**, which also allows you to ask for a copy of your personal data undergoing processing.



The **right to rectification**, which allows you to request us to correct, without undue delay, anything that you think is wrong with the personal data we have on file about you, and to complete any incomplete personal data.



The **right to erasure** allows you, under certain conditions, to ask that we delete your personal data.



The **right to restrict the processing of your personal data** allows you to request restriction of the processing of your personal data where you believe your data is inaccurate or the processing activity is unlawful.



Where applicable, the right to ask us to stop using your personal data (**right to object**) on grounds relating to your particular situation, at any time.



Where applicable, you have the **right to data portability**, which is the right to receive your personal data, which you have provided to the controller, in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format, and the right to transmit those data to another controller.



Finally, you have the right to lodge a complaint at the EDPS as a supervisory authority: https://edps.europa.eu/data-protection/our-role-supervisor/complaints_en.

Please note that in some cases, restrictions under Article 25 of the Regulation may apply.

The time limit for treating your request is one (1) month. This period may be extended by two (2) further months where necessary, taking into account the complexity and the number of the requests. In those cases, the EDPS and/or EDPB will inform you of the extension within one (1) month of receipt of your request and will provide reasons for the delay.
