2/Description

The Safety, Environment and Security (SES) sector coordinates and monitors works on the JRC Petten site in order to verify the correct application of health and safety standard through the JRC, according to the Dutch Law. The areas covered include safety at work, fire prevention, environment protection, security, hygiene and health and where appropriate radioprotection.

The Site Safety Officer conducts "Safety Tours" in all JRC Petten buildings and all units which address any works done on site that might entail any potentially hazardous situation. The Site Safety Officer writes minutes of such too wherein those present are listed. These are sent to line management and relevant safety figures. Staff of SES may also carry out investigations following either injuries or near accidents reports. Where applicable, report is sent to the hierarchy and safety line management of the staff/person concerned. For statistical purposes, a excel file recording each accident is kept by the Site Safety Officer. This processing of personal data is subject to art.27.
