

EDPS Formal comments on the draft Commission Implementing Decisions amending Commission Implementing Decisions C(2023) 645 and Decision C(2023) 649 of 1.2.2023 laying down and developing the universal message format (UMF) standard pursuant to Regulations (EU) 2019/817 and 2019/818 of the European Parliament and of the Council

THE EUROPEAN DATA PROTECTION SUPERVISOR,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EU) No 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data by the Community institutions and bodies and on the free movement of such data ('EUDPR')¹, and in particular Article 42(1) thereof,

HAS ADOPTED THE FOLLOWING FORMAL COMMENTS:

1. Introduction and background

1. On 16 April 2025, the European Commission consulted the EDPS on two draft Commission Implementing Decisions amending Commission Implementing Decisions C(2023) 645 and Decision C(2023) 649 of 1.2.2023 laying down and developing the universal message format (UMF) standard pursuant to Regulations (EU) 2019/817² and 2019/818³ of the European Parliament and of the Council ('the draft Implementing Decisions')⁴.
2. Regulations (EU) 2019/817 and 2019/818, which establish a framework of interoperability between the EU information systems in the field of borders, visa, police and judicial cooperation, asylum and migration, provide for a universal

message format (UMF) to serve as a standard for structured, cross-border information exchange between information systems, authorities or organisations in the field of Justice and Home Affairs. The specific UMF standard was subsequently adopted with Commission Implementing Decisions C(2023) 645 and C(2023) 649⁵.

3. The objective of the draft Implementing Decisions is to ensure that, following the adoption of Regulation (EU) 2024/1358 (Eurodac recast Regulation)⁶, the European Asylum Dactyloscopy Database (Eurodac) is developed in a UMF compliant manner⁷.
4. The draft Implementing Decisions are adopted pursuant to Article 38(3) of Regulation (EU) 2019/817 and Article 38(3) of Regulation (EU) 2019/818 of the European Parliament and of the Council.
5. The EDPS has previously issued formal comments on the drafts of the current Commission Implementing Decisions C(2023) 645 and C(2023) 649⁸, as well as Opinion 4/2018 on the Proposals for two Interoperability Regulations⁹.
6. The present formal comments of the EDPS are issued in response to a consultation by the European Commission of 22 April 2025, pursuant to Article 42(1) of EUDPR. The EDPS welcomes the reference to this consultation in Recital 11 of the draft Implementing Decisions.
7. These formal comments do not preclude any additional comments by the EDPS in the future, in particular if further issues are identified or new information becomes available, for example as a result of the adoption of other related implementing or delegated acts¹⁰.

8. Furthermore, these formal comments are without prejudice to any future action that may be taken by the EDPS in the exercise of his powers pursuant to Article 58 of the EUDPR and are limited to the provisions of the draft Proposal that are relevant from a data protection perspective.

2. Comments

9. The EDPS notes that the subject matter of the draft Implementing Decisions is limited to ensuring that the European Asylum Dactyloscopy Database (Eurodac) is developed in a UMF compliant manner. As a result, the EDPS considers that the draft Implementing Decisions would not have any substantial impact on the protection on individuals' rights and freedoms with regard to the processing of personal data.
10. In light of the above, the EDPS has no specific comments or recommendations on the proposed draft Commission Implementing Decisions amending Commission Implementing Decisions C(2023) 645 and Decision C(2023) 649.
